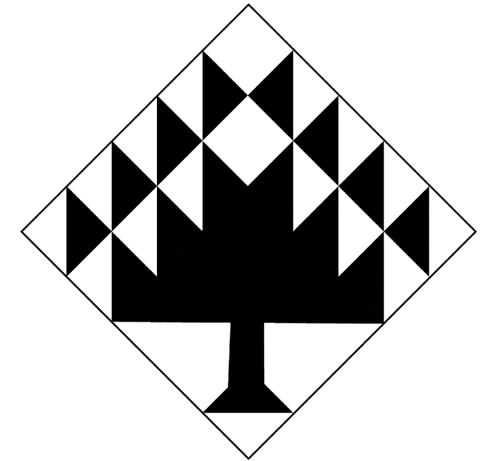
Evening meeting: Door greeters 5:15-6:25 p.m. 6:30 p.m. Program, business meeting, and show and tell.

Quilting Bee: This is an ongoing group. It is open to all members of the Evergreen Quilters Guild. We meet at Grace Lutheran Church (our regular meeting place) at 10 a.m.-2 p.m. every 4th Tuesday in the Rock room.

FAQs

Are sewing retreats (Sewing Camp) available? Yes. The Evergreen Quilters Guild schedules two retreats (sewing camps) per year - one in the fall and the other one in the winter. The camps run from Friday to Sunday. After the camps are scheduled, dates are announced at the next meeting. Payment is expected when you sign up.

What is Quilting 101? At noon we have a short demo of a quilting technique.

What are Comfort Quilts? These quilts go to St. Vincent Hospital's Pediatric Ward. The quilts are placed on the beds to welcome the child to the room with color to comfort them in a difficult situation and help them feel more secure. Lap size (45"x 60"). They may be tied or machine quilted. Any color, style, pattern, print or pre-printed panels may be used. Bright fabrics are preferred.

What are Service Quilts? Service quilts are made by our members. The quilts are twin size (60 x 80 inches). Members make the tops and then they are either tied or long armed. The quilts are donated to homeless shelters, Golden House, and other charities. We welcome donations for this worthy project. The fabric should be washed and able to withstand repeated washings.

What are Soldier Quilts? The guild collects quilts for wounded soldiers of Wisconsin. These are then distributed to our wounded from here to the Fisher House in Milwaukee. The size of a quilt should be lap size, which is 45" x 60" or larger. Colors that go into these range from your traditional red/white/blue, to browns and greens. Machine quilting is the preference. A label with a note that these were made by Evergreen Quilters is attached to the quilt.
