

Days for Girls Liners

- Made with Flannel
- Wash and dry flannel before making the liners

To make 48 liners which is enough for 6 kits:

- 3 1/8 yards of fabric A (buying 1/8 yard more to allow for shrinking)
- 2 1/8 yards of fabric B (buying 1/8 yard more to allow for shrinking)

Cutting:

- Fabric A - Cut 12 - 9" strips.
- Fabric B - Cut 12 - 6" strips.

Making the liners:

- Serge both long sides of the 6" strips (Fabric B).
- Place the 6" strip down the center of the 9" strip (Fabric A) for the full length of the strips. Be sure to position them "dull sides together" (in sewing terms this is called "wrong sides together").



- Using the regular sewing machine with a straight stitch, stitch the 6" strip to the 9" strip. Stitch near the edge, directly over the serged stitches; this will further secure the edge of the narrow strip. Use a medium stitch length.
- Subcut into 9" squares. You'll get 4 per strip.
- Serge all around the square.
