Fabric: This is a sampler class. Multicolored hand dyed cotton, or blending tone on tone colors of quilters' weight cotton fabric. Fabric should have at least 75% medium or light value/colors. Avoid dark value fabric and larger or small repetitive patterned fabric, which would call attention away from the beading.

Size: small square or rectangular pieces. Example: 8" by 10", 10" by 14", etc. It would be difficult to bead if the fabric is larger than 18" in either direction. Pick a piece which "calls out to you", one you would enjoy embellishing with beads. Do not use batiks.

Hand baste the above fabric to white, beige or light gray flannel or thin cotton batting. Do not use polyester batting or cotton/poly mix. Cut the "batting layer" 2" longer and wider than the fabric. Center the fabric on the "batting" for basting so that you have 1 extra inch of "batting" on all sides. Baste the two layers together (without a quilt backing). Baste in an approximate 3" grid pattern as if you were preparing the top and flannel or cotton batting for machine quilting.

Bring from home:

A few straight pins

Small sharp scissors or embroidery scissors

Paper scissors

Cool Whip size lid, or white, non-segmented small glass or ceramic plate to hold the beads or Vellux beading cloth to bead off

Glasses if needed for handwork

Lamp with extension cord

Power strips to share

Evergreen Quilters Guild Workshop Policies

A member is considered registered for a workshop/class when fees are paid. In the event there is a great deal of interest in a class, those who pay the fee are registered first and guaranteed a spot in the class.

Classes/workshops will be opened up to non-members one month prior to the class. A \$20 surcharge, in addition to the class fee, is charged for a non-member to attend a workshop/class.

Whenever Evergreen Quilters Guild splits expenses with a neighboring guild, that guild's members will qualify for the Evergreen Quilters Guild member fee for the class.

If a registered and paid member must withdraw from an Evergreen Quilters Guild class, the following applies: If it is more than sixty days before the class, the member will receive a full refund from the Evergreen Quilters Guild Treasurer. If within fifty-nine days of the class, no refund is issued. A member can find a replacement for the class on her own and any financial arrangements are between the two members.
