A-1	Landscape/Still Life- The main focus is realistic scenery or groupings of people, animals, objects or plant life. Examples: woodland scene, fruit in a bowl, flower garden, view through a window, etc.		
A-2	Figurative/Portrait- The main focus is a single, recognizable, figure-such as a person or animal.		
	Examples: self-portrait, one dog, woman in the woods, (with the focus being the woman, not the woods), etc.		
A-3	Surreal/Fantasy- The main focus is a recognizable but unrealistic object, person or setting. Think imagination, dream world and fantasy. Examples: moon wearing glasses, floating people, flying car, pig reading a book, etc.		

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Abstract- Art that does not attempt to represent external, recognizable reality, but seeks to achieve its effect using shapes, forms, A-4 colors, textures, and geometrics.

Modern (MN) - Inspired by modern design. Characteristics include, but are not limited to: the use of bold colors and prints, high contrast and graphic areas of solid color, improvisational piecing, minimalism, expansive negative space, and alternate grid work.
